Those who encourage – critique - keep us going! How did you find (or not find) your writing buddy? Are you a writing buddy for anyone else?

That's what we mean by writing buddies - those who encourage - critique - keep us going!

Since my husband is also a writer, I thought he would be a good writing/editing buddy. This has not proven to be the case. He is very good for my ego because he rarely finds anything that he would change and seems to enjoy the pieces that I ask him to review. As there is only so much editing I can do on my own work (either in love with my creation or overly critical of it), I look for feedback from a second set of eyes. I desire constructive criticism to help my writing grow in quality, and while praise is more than welcome, I also need to know how it can be improved. I have attended one writer's group meeting at a local library, but found that while those present were kind enough to my submissions as a first-time attendee, they seemed to only find fault with the writing of those who attend on a regular basis. As someone who is just now beginning to open myself and my efforts up to the public, I was turned off by this. A balance of appreciation and analysis of my writing is what I seek. I plan to check out a monthly writer's group that meets at one of the bookstores. Perhaps, there, I will find my writing buddy.

My writing buddies and soul mates are in the Writers Group at Fun N Sun. Every Tuesday afternoon year round we read our stories to each other. At first we did more critiquing than we do now. I like to think that's because we've become better writers. Yesterday I read an unfinished fiction story I'll be submitting to a local publication. I had my character where I wanted him but I was getting stuck on how to lead him to a compelling climax and a surprise ending. I got some great ideas from the group and now am all fired up to finish the story. It was a good exercise for all of us.

How to Find a Writing Buddy – Contributed by Bess McBride

Many of the major online writing groups have sections for finding critique partners, AKA writing buddies, though you might think them you're worse enemy when they've torn your manuscript apart. If you write romance, Romance Writers of America, www.rwanational.org. has many, many chapters throughout the United States, plus several online chapters, and most of those do have a critique partner connection service. Membership in the organization does cost though, which is really an important point. Writing is a solitary event. Writers need to find writing groups who match their interests. Most towns have writing groups. Check your local library. They know everything about books. Check your local bookstores to see if writing groups have a regular meeting there. Google, Google, Google... Keep in mind that while paying for a critique on your manuscript is an acceptable business, it can't really meet your needs for a "writing buddy" and there are many opportunities out there to find free partnering!

Starting a Writing Group – A History of Penwheels - Contributed by Alice Zyetz

The first group happened very naturally 15 years ago at an Escapade. At that time, in my small 21.5-foot fifth wheel all my books were strapped securely on a shelf over the back window. A new friend, DeAnna White, saw Natalie Goldberg's book, *Writing Down the Bones*.

The next time we were together, DeAnna invited three other new friends, Jaimie Hall (now Bruzenak), Betty Prange, and Judy Francis. The five of us picked some topics, wrote for ten minutes, and then shared. Thus the first group started.

The group has grown over the years and it is now traditional to have a Penwheels gathering at Escapade and do a writing practice. I also started a group at Jojoba Hills when I moved there five years ago. The best friends I have made on the road come from the sweet honesty of writing together. Follow Natalie's precepts and just write, don't think, be specific, and use your five senses to describe.

How to start:

- Buy Natalie's books, including *Bones*, *Wild Mind*, and any of her other writing books.
 She now has a great one on memoir writing.
- Invite people to come to your rig. Tell them it's a creativity session.
- Be supportive of each other. We are not a traditional critique group although you can always ask for feedback if you're planning to publish a piece.
- Devise your own story and word prompts. Write to me at <u>youshoulda@aol.com</u> for a recent copy of one of ours.
- Use Internet creativity sites for more ideas. Here are three I like, but there are plenty more:

Interactive Plot Generator (bottom of home page) http://writingfix.com/

Here are two good books that one of my Jojoba writers found:
 The Writer' Block by Jason Rebdak for word and situation prompts.
 In the Beginning collected by Hans Bauer for real first lines of books to use as story starters. Don't tell what book it came from until after everybody is finished.

Finally, be open to the laughter and tears, the creativity and camaraderie.

<u>Book Review</u> - Review of *Floor Sample: A Creative Memoir* by Julia Cameron – Contributed by Jaimie Bruzenak

I loved *The Artist's Way*, following the 12-week program faithfully and writing three morning pages for a year straight. I also enjoyed Julia Cameron's writing immensely in *The Right to Write, Sound of Paper and Walking in This World*. I just finished her memoir, *Floor Sample*. I did not enjoy it in the same way, though I was amazed at her productivity and variety of writing considering her life.

From her first drink, Julia was an alcoholic. Right away she had blackouts. She thought that drinking was a part of writing, the career she wanted. She was married to director Martin Scorsese. That didn't last. She tells her struggles with overcoming addiction and mental problems with brutal honesty, raising her daughter, and moving back and forth across the country between Taos, Los Angeles and New York.

I wondered, as I read, how she could be so prolific and so multi-talented considering the problems she faced. She has written and published poetry, short stories, fiction and nonfiction. She also has three musicals, including the songs and music, to her credit even though she thought she had zero musical talent. What was most helpful to me personally was how she learned to listen to her inner guidance.

Alice Zyetz and I attended a seminar led by Julia Cameron on The Artist's Way in Sedona, Arizona. We howled with laughter as she described her various personas and were re-inspired to write.

I found this book-a hardback-on sale for \$6.99-and bought it because I loved her other books. It was worth reading, though, in retrospect, I wouldn't have paid full price.
